



Bronze Sustainability Certification Achieved

Congratulations Lambertville Public School. The school community has met the rigorous requirements to achieve Sustainable Jersey for Schools certification. LPS is part of a group of 147 schools that achieved the Sustainable Jersey for Schools certification in 2020.

Sustainable Jersey for Schools, a program for pre-kindergarten through twelfth-grade public schools in New Jersey, is voluntary, but achieving certification takes commitment and collaborative effort. Each school that is certified at the bronze level must submit documentation to show it has completed a balanced portfolio of the program's [sustainability actions](#), attaining a minimum of 150 points.

Currently, a total of 969 schools and 352 school districts are participating in the Sustainable Jersey for Schools program overall.

It was launched by Sustainable Jersey, an organization that provides tools, training and financial incentives to support and reward municipalities and schools as they pursue sustainability programs.
